## **Helpful Tips and Notes**

- The 1890s is a difficult decade to locate records on. The 1890s Federal Census was destroyed in 1921 fire at U.S. Department of Commerce. There are no Washington, U.S., State and Territorial Censuses Ancestry for Snohomish for that decade.
- The Snohomish 1888 Sanborn is mislabeled for Avenue A; Avenue A does not appear in the 1888 Sanborn map.
- The 1900 Census does not list address numbers.
- Cedar Avenue and Maple Avenue in Snohomish (only the parts between 2nd Street and 5th Street) were called Spring Street and Lake Street in the 1888-1908 Sanborn Maps. Keep that in mind as you are looking at Census data on Ancestry or viewing the Sanborn Maps.
- It is helpful to know what lot and block your house is on (especially for older homes that existed before addresses were listed in the Census/Polk Directories).
- Snohomish County Online Property Information (SCOPI) is an interactive web map provides a visual method of locating and viewing property information like parcel IDs, tax assessments, sales history, and other property information.
- Polk Directories: The householders index—a listing of properties by address—is included in volumes from 1932 onward. Before 1932, searching must be done using the alphabetical name index. City directories often include occupations, family members, home ownership, and phone numbers. Entries in the Polk Directories are listed in a particular format using abbreviations for roads, avenues, etc. Examples:
  - Bettzig Eva (wid Andrew), res Cedar cor Commercial. (1893 Polk Directory)
  - Berglund Wm S, draughtsman, rms Ave D s e cor 3d. (1893 Polk Directory)
  - Hensel Louis W, res w s Av B bet 4th and 5th.
     (1894 Polk Directory)
  - Hinkley Elwin B (Knapp & Hinkley), res e s Lake nr 2d. (1894 Polk Directory)
  - Maughlin Wm (Maughlin Bros), res av A nr 3rd. (1903 Polk Directory)
  - Eagle Everett A, clk, r 218 av A. (1913 Polk Directory)
